The US-China rivalry over the Panama Canal sparks tensions, leaving Panama caught in a war of words.

Panama, known as the "bridge of the world," is caught in a growing conflict between the U.S. and China over control of the Panama Canal. U.S. President Trump accused China of secretly controlling the canal, through which 40% of U.S. container traffic passes, threatening military action to reclaim it. Panama's President José Raúl Mulino rejected these claims but sought to ease tensions by withdrawing from China's Belt and Road Initiative. Meanwhile, U.S. investment firm BlackRock bought ports near the canal, heightening U.S. concerns over Chinese influence, despite China's denial of control. The ongoing rhetoric has strained Panama's position.

Japan's biggest Yakuza crime group pledges to end decade-long gang war

Japan's largest yakuza syndicate, the Yamaguchi-gumi, has pledged to end its violent feud with a rival faction, authorities said. Three senior members delivered a letter to Hyogo police, vowing to stop all internal fighting and avoid causing trouble. The gang has been in conflict since 2015, when splinter groups formed the Kobe Yamaguchi-gumi, sparking deadly street battles. The violence led to increased police crackdowns and declining membership. The Yamaguchi-gumi, one of the world's wealthiest crime groups, has faced mounting pressure to cease hostilities as authorities tighten control over organized crime in Japan's major cities.

Hudson River helicopter crash kills family

Six people, including three children, died after a helicopter carrying a Spanish tourist family crashed into the Hudson River in New York. The victims included Agustín Escobar and his wife Mercè Camprubí Montal, both Siemens executives, and their children aged 4, 5, and 11. The sixth victim was the pilot. New York City Mayor Eric Adams confirmed the deaths and expressed condolences to the families. The cause of the crash is under investigation. The tragic incident has drawn widespread mourning, with authorities working to determine what led to the fatal accident. The family had been visiting as tourists.
