Trump questions Putin's desire for peace after meeting Zelensky at the Vatican

Donald Trump questioned Vladimir Putin's willingness to end the war in Ukraine after meeting Volodymyr Zelensky at Pope Francis's funeral. Posting on Truth Social, Trump said Russia's missile strikes on Kyiv made him fear Putin was "tapping me along" and suggested tougher measures like "Banking" or "Secondary Sanctions." Earlier, Trump and Zelensky held a 15-minute "very productive" meeting, according to the White House. Zelensky called it potentially "historic." This was their first meeting since a tense Oval Office encounter. Meanwhile, the Kremlin said Putin expressed readiness for direct talks with Ukraine "without preconditions" during discussions with Trump's envoy Steve Witkoff.

Russia says it detained a "Ukrainian intelligence agent" over car blast that killed a Russian general

Russian authorities have detained a man described as a "Ukrainian special services agent" over a car explosion that killed General Yaroslav Moskalik near Moscow. The suspect allegedly bought the car that exploded in Balashikha and planted an explosive device, according to Russia's FSB. The blast, reportedly detonated remotely from Ukraine, killed Moskalik, deputy head of Russia's Main Operations Directorate. Photos showed the suspect driving a car matching the one involved. Russian media aired footage of his alleged confession, though it's unclear if it was made under duress.

Number of people killed' after car Vancouver Filipino festival

A driver plowed into a crowd during a Filipino heritage festival in Vancouver on Saturday night, killing and injuring several people, according to police. The incident occurred shortly after 8 p.m., and the driver is now in custody. Videos showed plows into crowd at families enjoying cultural dances, performances, and food stalls. Prime Minister Mark Carney called the attack "horrific," offering condolences to the victims and the Filipino Canadian community. Vancouver Mayor Ken Sim also expressed deep sorrow, saying more details would be shared as the investigation progresses.
