#### Trump calls Bezos as Amazon says no plan to show tariff price rises

President Trump called Jeff Bezos after reports surfaced that Amazon planned to show customers the cost of tariffs on imports. Amazon later said it considered itemizing tariffs on its discount platform Amazon Haul, but the idea was never approved. The White House criticized the move as political, with Trump's press secretary calling it "a hostile act." Trump has sharply raised tariffs on imports, especially from China, leading to price hikes and trade tensions. Despite past tensions, Trump praised Bezos after the call, saying he "solved the problem." Amazon confirmed the plan was dropped and not influenced by political pressure.

## against Houthis in US operation under Trump

Britain, in coordination with the United States, launched airstrikes against Houthi targets in Yemen-marking the first public acknowledgment of a joint operation **UK launches strikes** since the Trump administration escalated its military campaign against the group. The strikes hit buildings south of Sanaa used to manufacture drones. The UK said Yemen, in first joint the mission was carefully planned to minimize civilian risk. This response follows Houthi attacks on international shipping since November 2023. Despite over 800 U.S. strikes, the group remains capable, and concerns grow over civilian casualties. A recent alleged strike on a migrant detention center prompted an investigation by U.S. Central Command.

Pakistan claims 'credible intelligence' India is planning an imminent military strike

Pakistan's Information Minister, Attaullah Tarar, stated that the country has "credible intelligence" indicating that India plans to launch a military strike within 24 to 36 hours. This follows India's accusation that Pakistan supported militants behind the deadly attack in Indian-administered Kashmir that killed 26 tourists. Tarar warned that any Indian military action would be met with a strong response. The situation in Kashmir remains tense, with ongoing searches and detentions in India, and speculation about a potential Indian military response similar to previous strikes in 2016 and 2019 following militant attacks
