Asian stocks see their worst rout in decades after Trump tariffs

Asian stocks plunged on Monday to levels not seen in decades, as global markets continue to reel from US President Donald Trump's tariffs, The Shanghai Composite was down more than 8% at one point, Hong Kong's dropped more than 13% and Japan's Nikkei 225 closed down by 7.8% European markets too fell in early trading, with banks and defence firms seeing the biggest drops. This follows global slumps last week after Trump announced new tariffs between 10% and 46% on most countries.

This is a blow for Asia's manufacturing hubs that count the US as a key market for exports ranging from clothes to cars.



Palestinian American teen shot dead by Israeli soldiers in West Bank, official says

A Palestinian-American teenager was killed by Israeli soldiers' gunfire, and two others were injured in the occupied West Bank on Sunday, according to Palestinian officials. The governor of Ramallah, Laila Ghannam, said that a 14year-old Palestinian-American boy was shot dead by Israeli forces in the village of Turmus Ayya. Two other Palestinian-American boys were injured in the same incident, according to the village mayor, Lafi Shalabi. The Palestinian Authority's Ministry of Health stated that one of the boys was seriously injured, while the other sustained minor wounds and was transported to a hospital in Ramallah. This incident could lead to tensions in U.S.-Israeli relations due to the killing of one of its citizens.



Blackwater founder **Erik Prince joins** security operation in **Ecuador**

Erik Prince, founder of the controversial security contractor formerly known as Blackwater, joined in law enforcement operations in Guayaquil, one of Ecuador's most violent cities, according to local officials ,The operations saw 10 houses raided and 40 people detained, Ecuador's Interior Minister John Reimberg said, Since early this morning, the security block together with the American Erik Prince, a security expert, and the Ministers of Defense, Gian Carlo Loffredo and the Minister of the Interior, John Reimberg, were deployed in territory in Guayaquil, especially in the suburbs, attacking criminals and outlining strategies to strengthen the great actions of our law enforcement forces in the field of operations, Ecuador's Defense.
