Israel warns Lebanon after first rocket attack since ceasefire Rocket fire from Lebanon into northern occupied territories has reignited border tensions, marking the first such attack since the November ceasefire. While no group has claimed responsibility, Israel has vowed a "severe response," warning Lebanon to rein in Hezbollah. The Israeli military intercepted three rockets over Metula, prompting retaliatory artillery fire into southern Lebanon. Meanwhile, Hezbollah, under financial and political strain, has yet to respond. Lebanon's President Joseph Aoun is pushing for state control over weapons, challenging Hezbollah's dominance. With the ceasefire at risk, fears of a broader escalation grow, deepening instability in an already volatile region.

Trump revokes legal status for 530,000 Cubans, Haitians, Nicaraguans and Venezuelans Trump's decision to revoke legal status for 530,000 migrants from Cuba, Haiti, Nicaragua, and Venezuela marks a significant shift in U.S. immigration policy, reinforcing his administration's hardline stance. This move could lead to mass deportations, increased legal battles, and heightened diplomatic tensions with affected countries. Many migrants now face uncertainty, as it remains unclear how many have secured alternative protections. Politically, this policy reversal may energize Trump's base while drawing criticism from human rights organizations and immigration advocates. If enforced aggressively, it could strain local economies and social services, especially in states with large migrant populations.

Japan, China, South Korea meet at geopolitical 'turning point in history'

The high-level meeting between Japan, China, and South Korea highlights both the urgency of regional cooperation and the deep geopolitical divides that remain. While the three nations agreed to push for a trilateral summit and discussed economic ties, tensions over North Korea, Taiwan, and China's support for Russia continue to loom large. Japan is pushing to ease China's ban on its seafood imports, signaling a potential thaw in trade relations. However, with Tokyo and Seoul strengthening ties with Washington and Beijing expanding its influence, the region remains on edge. The coming months will test whether diplomacy can bridge these divides or if competition will escalate.
