Radioactive wasp nest found at old **US nuclear** weapons site

A radioactive wasp nest with radiation levels ten times the legal limit was found at the Savannah River Site in South Carolina, a former nuclear weapons facility. The nest was treated and disposed of as radiological waste. Officials say it posed no threat to the public or environment and was likely contaminated by legacy radiation from Cold War-era operations. No wasps were present, and no leaks were detected. Environmental groups, however, criticized the government's lack of transparency. The Department of Energy insists the contamination was contained, but watchdogs demand clearer answers about the source and potential risks.

A sinkhole revives debate about migrant workers' rights in Singapore When a 3m-deep sinkhole swallowed a car in Singapore, nearby migrant workers rushed to rescue the driver, drawing widespread praise online. Their heroic act has reignited debate over migrant workers' rights. These workers, mostly from countries like India and Bangladesh, make up a large portion of Singapore's labor force, often in low-paid, physically demanding jobs. Many face poor living conditions, low wages, and transport risks, including being crammed into unsafe trucks. Despite past promises of reform, little has changed. Advocates say that while society applauds their bravery, it continues to overlook their struggles and exploitative treatment.

Young Ukrainians get their way as Zelensky overturns law to defuse crisis

Mass protests by young Ukrainians forced President Zelensky to backtrack on a controversial law that undermined two key anti-corruption agencies, NABU and SAP. The law had shifted prosecution powers to a presidential appointee, sparking the largest demonstrations since Russia's full-scale invasion. Protesters viewed the independence of these bodies as vital to Ukraine's democratic future and EU aspirations. Just ten days after passing the law, MPs voted unanimously to repeal it, following mounting pressure. While Zelensky claimed it affirmed Ukraine's democracy, critics raised concerns about his commitment to reform and the influence of his unelected aide, Andriy Yermak.
