Trump's plan to send troops to Chicago is abuse of power, Illinois governor says

Illinois Governor JB Pritzker criticized President Trump's plan to deploy National Guard troops to Chicago as an abuse of power, saying there is no emergency and accusing Trump of "manufacturing a crisis." Trump has already sent about 2,000 troops to Washington DC, now armed, despite local opposition. Chicago Mayor Brandon Johnson called any deployment "uncoordinated, uncalled for, and unsound," warning it could inflame tensions. The mission supports federal agencies and ICE, but polls show strong unpopularity among residents. Trump hinted at declaring a national emergency to extend troop presence and requested \$2 billion for city improvements.

Russia blames nuclear site attack on Ukraine as Kyiv marks independence day

Russia blamed Ukrainian drone attacks for a fire at a nuclear power plant in Kursk and another blaze at the port of Ust-Luga, though no injuries were reported and radiation levels remained normal. Ukraine has not commented. The IAEA urged protection of all nuclear facilities. The incidents coincided with Ukraine's Independence Day, when President Zelensky reaffirmed the country's fight for sovereignty, stating Ukraine "has not yet won, but has certainly not lost." International support was highlighted as US envoy Keith Kellogg and Canada's PM Mark Carney attended celebrations, while King Charles sent a letter praising Ukrainians' resilience and hope for lasting peace.

Brazilian police say ex-President **Bolsonaro** had planned to flee to Argentina seeking asylum

Brazil's federal police said former President Jair Bolsonaro drafted a request for political asylum in Argentina after his home was raided in a coup investigation. The request was addressed to President Javier Milei, and Bolsonaro also spent two nights at the Hungarian Embassy in Brasília, raising suspicion he sought to avoid arrest. Police accuse him and his son Eduardo of obstructing justice by violating house arrest terms and spreading content against democratic institutions. Justice Alexandre de Moraes gave his lawyers 48 hours to explain the asylum request and other breaches.
