Austrian energy executive fired over alleged Russian spying links

An executive at Austrian energy company OMV was dismissed amid allegations of spying for Russia, according to magazine Profil. Authorities say he had repeated meetings with a Russian diplomat believed to be an FSB agent, and Austria's intelligence services had been monitoring him for months. The Foreign Ministry summoned the diplomat and requested he waive immunity, otherwise he would be declared persona non grata. OMV terminated his contract immediately and is fully cooperating with investigations. While this move reasserts Austria's commitment to protect strategic sectors, it raises concerns about corporate control, insider access, and both national security and international diplomatic tensions.

French President Emmanuel Macron announced that UN sanctions on Iran are expected to be reinstated before the end of the month, after recent talks with the E3 (Britain, France, Germany) were deemed insufficiently serious. The E3 launched a 30-day snapback process in late August, offering Iran more time if it restored IAEA inspections, accounted for its enriched uranium stockpiles, and entered talks with the U.S. While Tehran claims to have submitted a fair proposal, diplomats say no meaningful progress has been made.

European airports snarled by cyberattack, disruption to stretch into Sunday

A cyber-attack on Collins Aerospace's MUSE check-in and boarding software caused major delays and cancellations starting Saturday at European airports including Brussels, Heathrow, Berlin, and Dublin. Electronic check-in and baggage drop systems failed, forcing shifts to manual processes. Brussels asked airlines to cancel up to half of its departing flights to avoid chaos, while Heathrow and Berlin reported delays but lesser cancellations. Authorities are investigating the breach; Collins is working to restore secure functionality. The incident underscores risks in relying on centralized digital systems in aviation.
