A US appeals court has ruled that most of Donald Trump's tariffs are illegal, striking down his use of the International Emergency Economic Powers Act to justify them. In a 7-4 decision, the court said tariffs are a core congressional power and cannot be imposed by presidential emergency declarations. The ruling affects Trump's tariffs on China, Mexico, Canada, and others, but will not take effect until October 14, allowing time for a Supreme Court appeal. Trump blasted the decision on Truth Social, warning it would "destroy" the US and arguing tariffs are vital for national strength and financial security.

Manhunt in Australian bush brings long-dismissed conspiracy theorists to the fore

Porepunkah, a quiet town in the Australian Alps with about 1,000 residents, has become the focus of a massive manhunt after two police officers were killed. Police allege Dezi Freeman, a self-proclaimed "sovereign citizen" hostile to authority, opened fire when officers arrived at his property with a search warrant linked to a sex crimes case. Detective Neal Thompson, nearing retirement, and Senior Constable Vadim De Waart were fatally shot, while another officer was critically injured. Freeman fled into nearby bushland, prompting a large-scale search with helicopters, armored vehicles, and heavily armed officers. The attack has reignited concerns over anti-government extremism.



Three dead after protests over death of taxi driver in Indonesia

Three people were killed after protesters set fire to a council building in eastern Indonesia during nationwide unrest over the death of Affan Kurniawan, a 21-year-old ride-sharing driver run over by a police vehicle in Jakarta. His death has sparked mass demonstrations over low wages and political expenses, testing President Prabowo Subianto, who visited Kurniawan's family to offer condolences and later issued an apology. His funeral on Friday was attended by colleagues, police chief Asep Edi Suheri, and politicians including Anies Baswedan. Violent clashes erupted in Jakarta and Surabaya, with protesters demanding justice despite appeals for calm and stability.
