Trump may speak to Xi about **Nvidia** chip

Donald Trump said he may discuss Nvidia's advanced Blackwell AI chip with Chinese President Xi Jinping during their upcoming meeting, expressing optimism about their first encounter since his return to the White House. The sale of U.S.-made AI chips to China has been a major tension point amid ongoing trade talks. Washington has restricted Nvidia from exporting high-end chips, citing military concerns. Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang confirmed the company has not applied for export licenses due to China's stance but hoped that would change, stressing China's importance as a market. The meeting follows months of strained U.S.-China tech relations.

Trump says in retaliatory strikes

Israel continued airstrikes on Gaza Wednesday, killing dozens, after claiming a Palestinian militant attack killed one Israeli soldier — the latest challenge to the fragile U.S.-backed ceasefire. Gaza health officials said at least 70 people were killed in ceasefire holds as strikes on Bureij camp, Gaza City's Sabra neighborhood, and Khan Younis. Both sides Israel pounds Gaza accused each other of violating the truce. President Donald Trump insisted the ceasefire "is not at risk," defending Israel's right to respond. He said Hamas must "behave" to preserve peace. Turkey condemned Israel's renewed attacks as violations of the ceasefire, while Israel denied genocide allegations currently before the International Court of Justice.

Fear of mass killings as thousands trapped in besieged Sudan city taken by militia group

Fears are growing of mass killings in El Fasher after Sudan's paramilitary Rapid Support Forces captured the city from government troops. The military confirmed it withdrew amid reports of systematic destruction and killing of civilians. The UN cited credible allegations of summary executions, and Yale's Humanitarian Research Lab identified satellite imagery showing piles of bodies and apparent pools of blood. Humanitarian teams reported house-to-house raids, sexual violence and attacks on escape routes. Survivors described massacres and loss of contact with relatives. International bodies urged de-escalation and condemned alleged war crimes, while thousands flee a deepening humanitarian crisis and urgent appeals.
