New Supreme
Court term will
reshape Trump's
powers

The US Supreme Court begins its new term with major cases that could define President Donald Trump's executive power. Issues include his attempts to control National Guard units, cut federal spending, and dismiss independent officials. The court will also review policies on birthright citizenship, tariffs, and economic control. Social cases include bans on conversion therapy and transgender athletes in sports. Experts say this term will test the limits of presidential authority, while growing reliance on the "shadow docket" raises concerns about transparency. With a 6-3 conservative majority, the court could again reshape key aspects of American law.

One iPhone led police to gang suspected of sending up to 40,000 stolen UK phones to China

UK police have dismantled an international gang accused of smuggling up to 40,000 stolen phones from the UK to China over the past year. In the country's largest operation against phone theft, 18 suspects were arrested and more than 2,000 devices recovered. Police believe the gang was behind half of all phones stolen in London. The investigation began after a victim tracked their stolen iPhone to a Heathrow warehouse containing nearly 900 other stolen phones bound for Hong Kong. Forensic evidence led to two suspects, and officers later intercepted a car carrying phones wrapped in foil to avoid detection.

Snapchat users
share fury at
upcoming fees for
storing old photos
and videos

Snapchat is facing backlash after announcing it will charge users who store more than 5GB of photos and videos in Memories, a feature previously free. Many users accused the company of "corporate greed," leaving one-star reviews and calling the fee a "memory tax." Snap compared the change to Apple and Google's paid storage options and said only a small number of users would be affected. Still, critics argue the move is unfair, as many rely on Memories to preserve years of content. Some users, like TikToker Guste Ven, say they plan to delete the app in protest.
