JP Morgan CEO Jamie Dimon has warned of a significant risk of a sharp decline in US stocks within the next six months to two years, saying he is "far more worried than others" about a market correction. In an interview with the BBC, Dimon said markets are not fully reflecting risks linked to geopolitical tensions, fiscal spending, and global rearmament. He added that while inflation remains a concern, he believes the Federal Reserve will stay independent. Announcing a £350m investment in JP Morgan's Bournemouth campus, Dimon also cautioned that much of the money flowing into artificial intelligence may ultimately be lost.

Escaped New
Orleans inmate
captured after 5
months on the run

Five months after 10 inmates escaped from a Louisiana jail, the last fugitive, 28-year-old Derrick Groves, has been captured in Atlanta, Georgia, after a brief standoff. Police used gas canisters before finding him hiding in a crawl space. Groves and nine others fled the Orleans Parish Justice Center in May by removing a toilet and breaking through metal bars. Most were caught within weeks. Groves had been serving a life sentence for a 2024 Mardi Gras shooting that killed two people. He now faces additional charges for the escape and will be extradited to Louisiana for prosecution.

Social media content restricted in Afghanistan, Taliban sources confirm The Taliban government has imposed new restrictions on social media in Afghanistan, affecting platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, and X. Sources from the Ministry of Communications said filters have been applied to block certain content, though details remain unclear. Users in Kabul and other provinces reported that videos no longer play and access to Instagram is slow or blocked. The move comes a week after a nationwide internet shutdown that disrupted businesses and communication. Cybersecurity group NetBlocks confirmed the restrictions appear deliberate. Since returning to power in 2021, the Taliban have tightened control over media and women's online and educational freedoms.
