Iraqis vote in election they expect to bring little reform

Iraqis began voting in parliamentary elections on Tuesday to elect a new 329-member legislature, with polling closing at 6:00 p.m. (1500 GMT). Prime Minister Mohammed Shia al-Sudani seeks a second term, but the growing youth electorate increasingly sees the elections as a way for established parties to divide the nation's oil wealth. Sudani's bloc is expected to win the most seats but may not secure a majority, leading to potential months of talks. Voter turnout is expected to drop below 41%, with many Iraqis disillusioned by corruption, poor services, and unemployment. Moqtada al-Sadr also boycotted the elections.

Venezuelan military preparing guerrilla response in case of US attack Venezuela is preparing for potential U.S. air or ground attacks by deploying Russian-made weapons, including old equipment, and planning a guerrilla-style resistance or chaos strategy. The shortage of personnel and equipment has led to these tactics, with small military units stationed at over 280 locations for sabotage. Another plan, dubbed "anarchization," aims to create disorder in Caracas using intelligence services and armed supporters. President Maduro has dismissed U.S. military threats but acknowledged that Venezuela's military is underprepared to face one of the world's strongest armies. Resistance strategies are seen as long shots for success.

Trump's deal with
South Korea
bogged down in
details over
submarine

Two weeks after U.S. President Donald Trump and South Korea's Lee Jae Myung announced they resolved tariff and security negotiations, no agreement has been released. The delay centers on South Korea's request for approval to build a nuclear-powered submarine, which Lee raised during their meeting at an Asia-Pacific forum. While Washington has approved nuclear fuel use for the submarine, the finalization of a factsheet outlining security and trade agreements is delayed due to ongoing adjustments from U.S. departments. Meanwhile, the South Korean won weakened by 0.7%, hitting a seven-month low, amid concerns over the delayed factsheet.
