A recent UNIFIL survey found that a concrete wall built by the Israeli military crosses the U.N.-mapped Blue Line, effectively making over 4,000 square meters of Lebanese territory inaccessible to locals. Another wall section under construction near Yaroun has also crossed the line, according to UNIFIL. The mission informed the Israeli army and requested removal, stressing that Israeli presence and construction on Lebanese land violate U.N. Security Council Resolution 1701 and Lebanon's sovereignty. The Israeli military denied the wall crosses the border, calling it part of a broader plan to reinforce the northern barrier. UNIFIL currently deploys over 10,000 troops.

China finds bigger role as US sidesteps Brazil climate summit

The United States' absence from COP30 has opened space for China to emerge as the central player in global climate diplomacy. At the Belem summit, China's large pavilion, high-profile clean energy executives, and active diplomats now occupy roles once filled by Washington. Observers say China's dominance in renewables and electric vehicles strengthens its influence, especially after President Trump withdrew the U.S. from the Paris Agreement and skipped sending a high-level delegation. Critics warn this retreat surrenders strategic ground as China expands green industries worldwide, with figures like California Governor Gavin Newsom cautioning that America risks falling irreversibly behind.

Nearly two dozen arrested as faith leaders protest outside Chicagoarea ICE facility Faith leaders and activists protested outside a federal ICE processing center in Broadview, Illinois, where 21 people, including pastor Michael Woolf, were arrested, highlighting growing tensions over President Trump's hardline immigration policies. The Chicago-area facility has become a focal point for opposition as the city limits cooperation with federal enforcement. Demonstrations since September have repeatedly led to clashes, with authorities using tear gas and less-lethal munitions. In a related development, a federal judge ordered the release of 13 ICE detainees after ruling the agency violated a 2022 agreement restricting warrantless arrests and trafficstop pretexts, underscoring mounting legal and political pushback.
