'Things happen' Trump defends
Saudi crown
prince over
Khashoggi killing

Former US President Donald Trump hosted Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman at the White House, dismissing a 2021 US intelligence assessment that said the prince approved the 2018 killing of journalist Jamal Khashoggi. Trump insisted the crown prince "knew nothing" about the murder and told reporters "things happen," urging them not to "embarrass our guests." Bin Salman called Khashoggi's death "painful" but said Saudi Arabia took all the right steps. Khashoggi's widow, Hanan, condemned Trump's stance and demanded an apology and compensation. The visit focused on major investment, nuclear and AI deals, and a potential F-35 fighter jet sale.

Cloudflare apologises for outage which took down X and ChatGPT Cloudflare suffered a major outage on Tuesday, disrupting access to major websites including X, ChatGPT, Zoom, Grindr and Canva. The issues began shortly after 11:30 GMT, with thousands reporting problems to Downdetector. Cloudflare said a faulty configuration file crashed key trafficrouting software, causing widespread errors. The company apologised, calling any outage "unacceptable" given its infrastructure role, and warned some services may still experience intermittent issues as systems fully recover.

Louvre heist suspects have admitted involvement in jewels theft

French authorities have arrested several suspects over the October 19, 2025 Louvre jewel heist, when thieves stole eight pieces of the French Crown Jewels worth about €88 million in a raid lasting under eight minutes. One man was detained at Charles de Gaulle Airport as he tried to board a flight to Algeria, after DNA linked him to a helmet left at the scene. Another suspect was arrested in the Paris suburbs; both have partially admitted involvement and face organised theft and conspiracy charges. More accomplices are believed to be at large, and the stolen jewels remain missing.
