Elon Musk's \$1tn pay deal approved by Tesla shareholders Tesla shareholders have approved CEO Elon Musk's record-breaking pay package, potentially worth nearly \$1 trillion, with 75% voting in favor during the company's annual meeting in Austin, Texas. The deal, one of the largest in corporate history, requires Musk to boost Tesla's market value from \$1.4 trillion to \$8.5 trillion and achieve milestones like deploying one million self-driving Robotaxi vehicles. Critics called the payout excessive, but the Tesla board argued it was vital to retain Musk. Celebrating on stage, Musk called the plan "a whole new book" for Tesla and emphasized the company's future focus on its Optimus humanoid robot project.

Harry apologises
to Canada for
wearing LA

during World
Series

Prince Harry apologised to Canada for wearing a Los Angeles Dodgers hat during the World Series game against the Toronto Blue Jays, joking he was "under duress." Invited by the Dodgers' owner, he said he wore the hat out of politeness but later realised it upset many Canadians, as King Charles is their head of state. In a CTV interview, wearing a Blue Jays cap, he quipped that he needed a hat under floodlights due to hair loss. He promised to support Toronto moving forward, though he admitted being a Blue Jays fan might not be well received in California.

Typhoon barrels towards Cambodia after killing at least 193 in Philippines and Vietnam Typhoon Kalmaegi has killed at least 188 people in the Philippines and five in Vietnam, with 135 still missing. The storm, which hit central Vietnam with winds up to 149km/h, uprooted trees, tore roofs, and caused widespread destruction, forcing thousands into shelters. Authorities in Vietnam warned of further flooding as heavy rainfall continued, while parts of the Philippines remain under a state of calamity after record rains and deadly mudslides. Vietnam deployed over 260,000 soldiers and closed several airports and expressways. The storm is now moving west toward Cambodia and Laos, leaving behind severe damage and devastated communities.
