**Trump says he will '100%' carry out Greenland tariffs threat, as EU vows to protect its interests**



Donald Trump has vowed to “100%” impose tariffs on European countries opposing his demand to take control of Greenland. European allies have rejected the threat, with Denmark stressing that sovereignty cannot be coerced, and the UK saying Greenland’s future is for Greenlanders and Danes to decide. Trump declined to rule out the use of force and said tariffs would apply to the UK and seven other Nato countries unless Denmark agrees to sell Greenland. He cited security concerns and said talks with Nato’s secretary general would continue, with a meeting planned in Switzerland.

**Spain to hold three days of mourning for victims of high-speed train crash**



Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez declared three days of national mourning after a high-speed train collision in southern Spain killed at least 40 people and injured more than 120. The crash occurred on Sunday evening near Adamuz, close to Córdoba, when a Madrid-bound train derailed and crossed onto the opposite track, colliding with another train heading south. Most casualties were in the front carriages of the second train. Sánchez vowed a full and transparent investigation, which officials say may take at least a month. It is Spain’s deadliest rail disaster in over a decade.

**Surfer injured in fourth shark attack in Australian state in 48 hours**



A 39-year-old surfer suffered minor injuries after a shark bit through his board near Crescent Head in New South Wales, marking the fourth shark attack along the NSW coast in under 48 hours. He is in stable condition. The incident follows three attacks in Sydney, including one that left a 27-year-old with life-changing injuries and another critically injuring a 12-year-old boy. Authorities believe bull sharks were involved. Heavy rainfall may have increased risk by reducing water visibility and drawing sharks closer to shore. Beaches in northern Sydney remain closed.
