**Carney says old world order 'is not coming back'**

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney said the “old order is not coming back” and urged middle powers to unite in a speech at the World Economic Forum in Davos. Warning that powerful nations are using tariffs and economic pressure as weapons, he said countries not at the table risk being “on the menu”. Carney reaffirmed Canada’s support for Greenland, Denmark and Nato, stressing its commitment to collective defence. Though he did not name Donald Trump, his remarks came amid US threats of tariffs and pressure over Greenland. Carney said Canada is building new coalitions and positioning itself as a stable, reliable global partner.

**Global markets on alert as Europe to suspend approval of US trade deal**

The European Parliament is set to suspend approval of a US-EU trade deal agreed in July, escalating tensions with Washington amid Donald Trump’s renewed threats of tariffs linked to his push over Greenland. The move, expected to be announced in Strasbourg, has unsettled global markets, fuelling fears of a trade war. European and US stocks fell sharply, while gold hit a record high above \$4,800 an ounce as investors sought safe havens. EU lawmakers said US threats against the sovereignty of an EU member state undermine trust and stability in transatlantic trade relations.

**Life sentence for man who killed Japan's ex-PM Shinzo Abe**

The man who assassinated Japan’s former prime minister Shinzo Abe has been sentenced to life in prison, more than three years after the 2022 shooting in Nara. Tetsuya Yamagami pleaded guilty, and prosecutors said life imprisonment was justified for the grave crime that shocked a country with almost no gun violence. His defence sought leniency, arguing he was a victim of “religious abuse” after his family was ruined by his mother’s donations to the Unification Church, and that his resentment toward Abe stemmed from the ex-leader’s links to the group. The case exposed political ties to the church and deeply divided public opinion.
