**Outrage after
Indian man drowns
in open pit after
begging for help for
hours**

The death of 27-year-old Indian IT professional Yuvraj Mehta after his car fell into an unmarked, water-filled construction pit in Noida has sparked nationwide outrage and renewed scrutiny of road safety and urban planning in India. Driving home late at night through dense fog, Mehta reportedly hit a low wall and plunged into the pit, where he remained stranded for nearly two hours before dying. Protests followed, with residents accusing authorities of negligence. The tragedy has ignited wider debate on unsafe roads, poor signage, abandoned construction sites and failing infrastructure, even in major urban centres near the capital.

**Three dead in
shooting in
Australia's New
South Wales**

Three people have been killed in a reported shooting in the small town of Lake Cargelligo in New South Wales, Australia, police said. A fourth person was taken to hospital in a serious but stable condition. The incident occurred around 16:40 local time near Walker Street. Two women and a man died at the scene. Authorities believe the shooting may be linked to domestic violence. The suspected gunman is still at large, prompting police to urge residents to stay indoors while heavily armed tactical units search the area. The town has a population of about 1,500.

**US allies won't
forget Trump
Greenland crisis**

After two weeks of escalating rhetoric, Donald Trump appears to have stepped back from threats over Greenland following intervention by Nato Secretary General Mark Rutte. Trump had spoken of ownership, tariffs and even military action after a recent US operation in Venezuela, alarming European allies. Behind the scenes diplomacy, including talks involving Denmark and Greenland, led to the creation of a working group on Greenland's future. Nato may now increase its military presence around the island, addressing US security concerns. Reports suggest Denmark could allow US bases in limited areas, easing tensions that had threatened Nato unity.
