Gaza-Egypt border reopens nearly two years after Israel closed it, official says



Rafah, Gaza's only crossing into Egypt, partially reopened Monday after nearly two years, allowing limited movement as part of phase one of a US-brokered ceasefire that began mid-October. The EU is operating the crossing with Egypt and other partners after preparations Sunday. Egypt-linked media said only 50 people per day may cross in each direction initially, far below earlier expectations. Patients and other civilians hope to travel for treatment, as Gaza hospitals offer limited care. Palestinian health officials say tens of thousands await travel approval. Israel says reopening will remain limited, excluding aid and commerce, after the last hostage's return.

Iran weighs nuclear diplomacy with US; gaps over missiles remain



Iran is weighing the terms for soon resuming talks with the United States, a foreign ministry official said on Monday, after both sides signaled readiness to revive diplomacy over the long-running nuclear dispute and ease fears of a new regional war. Tensions remain high amid a U.S. Navy buildup near Iran, following last month's violent crackdown on anti-government protests—the deadliest domestic unrest since Iran's 1979 revolution.

Conservative populist Laura Fernández claims victory in Costa Rica's elections



Right-wing populist Laura Fernández declared victory in Costa Rica's presidential election after early precinct counts suggested her ruling party would win a majority. Framing the result as a mandate to stay the course, Fernández promised to maintain and expand the government's hardline approach to public security, arguing that tough policing and stricter penalties are needed to curb crime. Opponents warn that such measures can erode civil liberties and fail to address root causes like inequality. Official results and final seat allocations are still pending as electoral authorities continue tallying votes nationwide. The outcome may shape debates on security and governance.
