Iran conditionally agrees to nuclear talks with US, first since Trump's military strikes last summer

Iran has agreed to resume nuclear talks with the U.S. to avoid military strikes, with discussions likely to be held in Oman. The talks follow escalating tensions, including U.S. threats and military deployments. Iranian President Pezeshkian confirmed the negotiations, though with conditions, including a focus on Iran's nuclear program. Tehran seeks to limit the talks' scope and exclude regional participants. Meanwhile, the U.S. has considered airstrikes targeting Iran's leaders and nuclear sites. The negotiations will involve multiple regional actors, including Qatar, Turkey, and Egypt, aiming to prevent further conflict.

Epstein files show Swiss bank CEO de Rothschild kept up years-long personal contact with financier

Ariane de Rothschild, CEO of Edmond de Rothschild, corresponded with financier Jeffrey Epstein for five years, arranging meetings before his 2019 arrest. U.S. Justice Department files reveal their personal contact, but no criminal wrongdoing is indicated. The emails, dating from the mid-2010s, show discussions about personal matters, including invitations to stay at Epstein's properties. De Rothschild, unaware of Epstein's crimes, condemned his actions. The release of these documents adds her to the list of prominent figures connected to Epstein, with the files coming after pressure from victims and lawmakers for full disclosure of his social circle.

The shocking truth behind historic anatomical art
