Japanese Prime**Minister****Takaichi's party****projected to secure large majority in snap election**

Japan's public broadcaster NHK, citing exit polls, projects that Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi's Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) will win a snap lower-house election with a large majority—potentially over 300 seats. That would comfortably exceed the 233 seats needed to govern. NHK also forecasts the ruling coalition of the LDP and the Japan Innovation Party could approach a two-thirds majority of the 465-seat chamber. Takaichi, a conservative, called the unusual snap vote just three months after taking office.

Australia's opposition coalition reunites after row over hate-speech laws

Australia's Liberal-National Coalition, the main opposition, has reunited after splitting on 22 January over proposed hate-speech reforms. Liberal leader Sussan Ley said the coalition is “looking to the future,” appearing with Nationals leader David Littleproud in Canberra. The Nationals had refused to back the government’s changes, citing free-speech concerns, after a December attack at a Jewish festival in Bondi Beach. The legislation would ban groups deemed to spread hate and toughen penalties for those who advocate violence. Both parties agreed neither can overturn joint “shadow cabinet” decisions.

Iran insists on right to enrichment, ready for confidence-building

Iran's foreign minister Abbas Araghchi said recognizing Iran's right to enrich uranium is essential for nuclear talks with the United States to succeed, rejecting any “zero enrichment” demand. After indirect U.S.-Iran talks in Oman, Araghchi said discussions should allow enrichment inside Iran while building confidence it remains peaceful. Tehran is open to negotiating enrichment levels and purity, alongside sanctions relief and de-escalation, a regional diplomat said. Araghchi added Iran's missile program is not on the agenda, and the next talks' location may change from Muscat.
