 **King 'ready to support' police as they assess Andrew claims over Epstein**

King Charles has intervened publicly amid fresh Epstein-file revelations, saying Buckingham Palace will support police if asked as they assess allegations involving his brother Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor. A palace spokesperson said the King is deeply concerned and that sympathy remains with victims of abuse. Thames Valley Police confirmed it is reviewing a complaint filed by the anti-monarchy group Republic, alleging misconduct in public office and breaches of official secrets. Newly released documents and emails are reported to suggest Andrew shared confidential travel reports and investment information with Epstein. Andrew denies wrongdoing, and being named in files is not proof of misconduct.

 **Ethiopia builds secret camp to train Sudan RSF fighters**

A visual investigation says Ethiopia is hosting a covert camp in Benishangul-Gumuz to train thousands of fighters for Sudan's RSF, highlighting the regional spillover of Sudan's civil war. Eight sources, including an Ethiopian official, allege the UAE financed construction and provided trainers and logistics, though Reuters could not independently verify this and the UAE denies involvement. Satellite images show hundreds of tents, heavy vehicle traffic, and ongoing expansion. Nearby Asosa airport has new infrastructure consistent with drone support. Sources say recruits may be deployed toward Sudan's Blue Nile front.

 **Trump the 'demolition' man of world order, European security experts warn**

The Munich Security Report 2026 warns the world is entering "wrecking-ball politics" led by U.S. President Donald Trump, putting the post-1945 U.S.-led international order under severe strain. The report calls Trump a leading "demolition man," arguing his approach could replace principled cooperation with transactional deals and weaken long-standing alliances and norms. Survey findings cited in the report show widespread pessimism about living standards and inequality, with many respondents across major countries viewing Trump's policies as harmful for the world. The Munich Security Conference runs Friday-Sunday; Trump will not attend.
