### Japan pledges \$10bn to help Asian countries deal with oil crisis

Japan has pledged \$10bn to help Asian countries, particularly in Southeast Asia, secure oil and energy supplies as the region faces disruption from the Iran war. Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi announced the initiative after a virtual meeting with Asian leaders, saying the framework will support crude oil and petroleum procurement, protect supply chains, and expand reserves. Leaders from countries including the Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Bangladesh, and South Korea welcomed the plan. Tokyo also stressed that the measure would not undermine Japan's domestic energy security despite growing regional concerns over oil shortages and rising prices.



### US and Hamas hold first direct talks since Gaza truce as ceasefire process stalls

The United States and Hamas have held their first direct talks since the Gaza truce began, in an effort to move forward the fragile US-brokered ceasefire. According to Hamas sources, the meeting took place in Cairo, where Hamas pressed for Israel to fully meet its phase one obligations, including halting strikes and allowing more humanitarian aid, before any shift to the next stage. Negotiations remain stalled over demands for Hamas to disarm, with both sides accusing each other of violating the agreement. The talks come amid continued Israeli strikes in Gaza and growing concern that the ceasefire process could collapse.



### Diplomatic push to secure Israel-Lebanon ceasefire intensifies after Washington talks

Diplomatic efforts to pressure Israel into accepting a ceasefire in Lebanon have intensified following unprecedented direct talks between Lebanese and Israeli officials in Washington. A senior Lebanese official said a full ceasefire remains a nonnegotiable condition before any formal peace negotiations can begin, stressing that Lebanon will not compromise on its territory. While the meeting marked a major diplomatic shift and was seen by some as a bold step, major obstacles remain. Fighting continues on the ground, internal political divisions persist, and Israel maintains that no ceasefire agreement can move forward unless Hezbollah is dismantled.
