Pope Leo addresses spat with Trump, says 'debate' is not focus of his Africa trip

This analysis argues that Donald Trump has repeatedly advanced ideas once seen as politically unthinkable, and that many Republican voters have increasingly accepted them. Citing several recent polls, the article says Republican support has extended to proposals involving attacks on Iranian civilian infrastructure, threats against Iran, military action in other countries, and even constitutionally or legally questionable ideas at home. It suggests this reflects less a debate over policy details than a broader pattern of political loyalty, through which Trump keeps pushing the boundaries of acceptable discourse and expands support for actions once considered extreme.

Harry and Meghan's trip felt like a royal tour - except many Aussies weren't interested

Harry and Meghan's four-day Australia visit resembled a royal tour, but as private citizens it drew limited public attention and some criticism over possible taxpayer-funded security. Their schedule focused on charity, Indigenous culture, sport, mental health, and community engagement, while carefully avoiding large public crowds. The couple showed warmth in personal encounters, yet their trip also blurred lines between philanthropy and business, with Meghan attending paid events and promoting ventures, while Harry spoke at a ticketed summit. Supporters argue their presence significantly benefited charities and organisations, while critics viewed some activities as tone-deaf amid Australia's cost-of-living pressures and public skepticism.

Zelensky condemns US extension of Russian sanctions waiver

President Volodymyr Zelensky condemned the US for extending a waiver allowing Russia to sell oil already loaded at sea until 16 May, arguing that oil revenue directly funds Moscow's war in Ukraine. Washington said the move was intended to ease energy shortages caused by the US-Israel war with Iran and disruptions in the Strait of Hormuz. Zelensky said Russia's shadow fleet could earn about \$10bn from these sales, helping finance new attacks. He also highlighted the scale of recent Russian strikes on Ukrainian cities. The decision drew criticism from Ukraine and European allies, while wider peace efforts remain stalled.
