**Israeli attacks on Lebanon 'grave violation' of US-Iran ceasefire**

Iran's deputy foreign minister, Saeed Khatibzadeh, told the BBC that Israel's Wednesday strikes on Lebanon were a grave violation of the US-Iran ceasefire, describing them as a massacre after Lebanon's health ministry reported 203 deaths. He also said the Strait of Hormuz would reopen only if the US ended its "aggression." As Beirut reels, questions remain over Israel's long-term strategy. Donald Trump said US forces will stay in the region until Iran fully complies with what he called the "real" ceasefire. Confusion persists over the deal's terms, including nuclear limits and whether the strait is actually reopening or stays closed.

**Oil prices rise as concerns grow over 'fragile' US-Iran ceasefire**

Oil prices and global markets turned volatile as doubts grew over whether the US-Iran ceasefire would hold. Brent crude rose to \$96.53 and WTI to \$97.02 after reports suggested Iran may keep the Strait of Hormuz closed following Israeli strikes on Lebanon. Tehran warned of a strong response if attacks continue, while Washington said US forces would stay until Iran complies with the ceasefire. Markets fell across Asia and Europe as uncertainty deepened over shipping access. With only a few vessels crossing the strait and a growing backlog, analysts warn energy flows, trade, and shipping costs could remain disrupted for weeks or months.

**UK farmers warn Iran ceasefire too late to stop higher food costs**

UK farmers are facing a sharp rise in costs after the Iran conflict pushed up fuel and fertiliser prices during peak planting season. Growers say the damage is already done for this season, even with a ceasefire, as higher costs are now locked in. Fertiliser prices have risen sharply, red diesel has nearly doubled for some, and transport and packaging costs are also climbing. Industry figures warn of another farming cost squeeze, with many farmers unable to absorb the increase. Some may raise food prices, while others fear they will make little or no profit, worsening pressure on an already fragile sector.
