Leading challenger to UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer quits government

Wes Streeting resigned as Britain's health secretary after declaring he had lost confidence in Prime Minister Keir Starmer's leadership and could not honourably remain in government. His departure follows Labour's poor local and devolved election results, which triggered a party revolt and calls from nearly 90 Labour MPs for Starmer to quit. Streeting has not yet launched a leadership bid, but would need 81 MPs to force a contest. In his resignation letter, he accused Starmer of lacking vision and direction, warning voters were losing faith and the UK could face deeper political instability before the scheduled 2029 general election.

Rescuers pull dead from rubble of Kyiv flats after massive Russian strikes

Russia launched one of its largest overnight attacks on Ukraine, killing at least five people, including a 12-year-old girl, and injuring dozens. Kyiv was heavily hit, with rescuers searching a damaged apartment building where more than 10 people may still be missing. President Volodymyr Zelensky said Russia fired more than 670 drones and 56 missiles, striking over 180 sites and damaging more than 50 residential buildings. Ukraine reported a 93% interception rate but called for stronger air defenses and continued sanctions. The attacks followed the expiry of a three-day ceasefire, undermining claims that the war may be nearing an end.

Smart glasses are 'an invasion of privacy' - Meta's are selling better than ever

Privacy concerns are growing around smart glasses, especially Meta's Ray-Ban AI glasses, as users secretly record women, workers and strangers for online content without consent. Although public filming is often legal, victims have little control once videos spread. Meta says users should act responsibly, but critics argue recording indicators are too subtle and misuse is widespread. Despite lawsuits and backlash, sales are rising, with Apple, Snap and Google preparing rival products. Experts warn that if millions adopt camera-equipped glasses, enforcing privacy rules in sensitive spaces will become difficult, especially if facial recognition is added. Public resistance is already emerging globally.
