China's Xi gives Putin a red-carpet welcome – and makes a veiled jab at the US

Xi Jinping welcomed Vladimir Putin in Beijing, framing China-Russia ties as a stabilizing force amid global turmoil and implicitly criticizing US dominance. The two leaders signed a joint statement supporting a multipolar world and opposing Trump's proposed "Golden Dome" missile defense system. Discussions covered strategic coordination, energy, trade, Ukraine, and the US-Israeli war with Iran, which Xi urged ending to protect supply chains. Putin praised relations as unprecedented, but arrived weakened by battlefield setbacks and economic dependence on China. Beijing used the visit to project diplomatic influence after recently hosting Trump and reshape the Western-led global order on its terms.

Ebola outbreak may be spreading faster than first thought, WHO doctor warns

A deadly Ebola outbreak in eastern DR Congo has sparked fear as WHO warns the virus may be spreading faster than first believed. Officials report 136 deaths and more than 514 suspected cases, with modelling suggesting the real number could exceed 1,000. Cases have reached other provinces, Uganda, and Goma, raising regional concern. Conflict, displacement, damaged health facilities, poor sanitation, and cross-border movement are complicating containment. WHO has released emergency funds and sent supplies, while neighbouring countries tightened screening. No vaccine exists for the Bundibugyo strain, but WHO is assessing possible protective treatments and urging communities to report symptoms quickly.

China confirms it will buy 200 Boeing jets after Trump-Xi summit

China confirmed it will buy 200 Boeing jets following last week's meeting between Donald Trump and Xi Jinping in Beijing. The deal includes US guarantees for aircraft engine parts and components, reopening a key market for Boeing. Both sides also agreed to work toward extending their tariff truce and reducing tariffs on at least \$30 billion worth of goods each. Trump described the trip as successful, citing the Boeing purchase and wider access for US farmers. Boeing expects more aircraft commitments beyond the initial 200. The announcement came as Xi met Vladimir Putin, underscoring Beijing's active diplomacy with both Washington and Moscow.
