Trump is losing his fight with the Fed

The Supreme Court dealt President Trump a major setback by ruling that Fed Governor Lisa Cook was denied due process in his attempt to remove her over unproven mortgage fraud allegations. The decision preserves, for now, the Federal Reserve's political independence and prevents Trump from gaining another appointment aligned with his demand for lower interest rates. The ruling was narrow and did not decide whether Cook could ultimately be removed "for cause." Meanwhile, inflation pressures from the Iran war and disrupted oil flows have reduced the likelihood of rate cuts, with Fed officials signaling possible hikes if inflation remains elevated this year.

Angry Venezuelans accuse government of negligence over earthquake response

Rescuers in La Guaira, Venezuela, paused operations to listen for survivors beneath a collapsed 12-storey building after twin earthquakes killed at least 1,700 people. Families waiting nearby accused authorities of responding too slowly, saying community members began digging before official teams arrived. Miguel Oscar Nunez searched for his son, while Kevin Montilla sought his wife and daughter. Elsewhere, residents reported digging with bare hands through destroyed apartment blocks, with rescue help reaching some areas days later and others not at all. Survivors fear many bodies may never be recovered, leaving the full scale of the disaster unknown.

Paraguay stun Germany on penalties to reach last 16

Germany exited the 2026 World Cup after losing 4-3 on penalties to Paraguay following a 1-1 draw after extra time. Julio Enciso gave Paraguay a surprise first-half lead before Kai Havertz equalised from Florian Wirtz's cross. Germany thought they had won in extra time, but Jonathan Tah's header was disallowed for a foul. In the shootout, Havertz and Nick Woltemade were denied by goalkeeper Orlando Gill, while Tah later missed in sudden death. Jose Canale scored the decisive penalty, sending Paraguay into the last 16 in Philadelphia and handing Germany their first-ever World Cup shootout defeat.
